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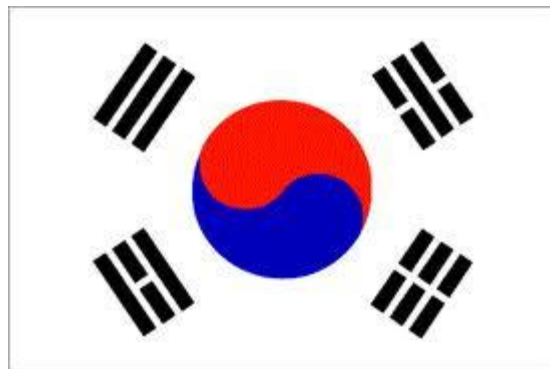


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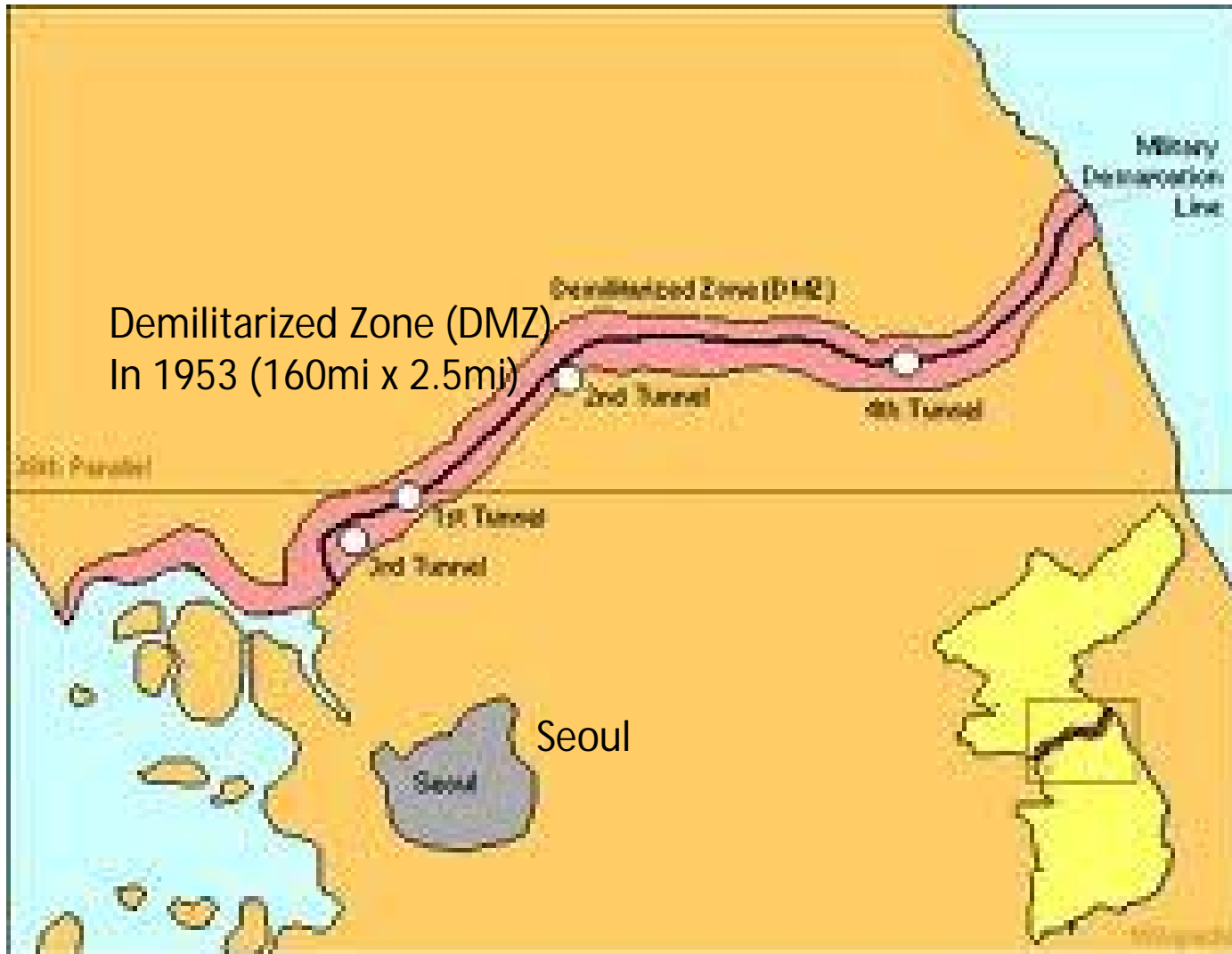

Korean History

- ? – 108 BC Gojoseon
- 300 BC – 57 BC Proto-Three Kingdoms
- 57 BC – 668 Three Kingdoms; Goguryeo, Baekje, Silla, Gaya
- 668 – 935 Unified Silla
- 698 – 926 Balhae
- 918 – 1392 Goryeo
- 1392 – 1897 Joseon
- 1897 – 1910 Korean Empire
- 1910 – 1945 Colonized by Japan
- 1945 – present division of Korea: North Korea (Communism), South Korea (Democracy)
- 1950 – 1953 Korean War between North Korea (Soviet Union & China allied) and South Korea (USA and Western allies)

- Korean Calendar; Dangi 4345 (=2012)



Korean Language

28 letters, the native phonetic alphabet system introduced by Sejong the Great in 1446 (called Hangeul) which has been reduced to 24 letters.

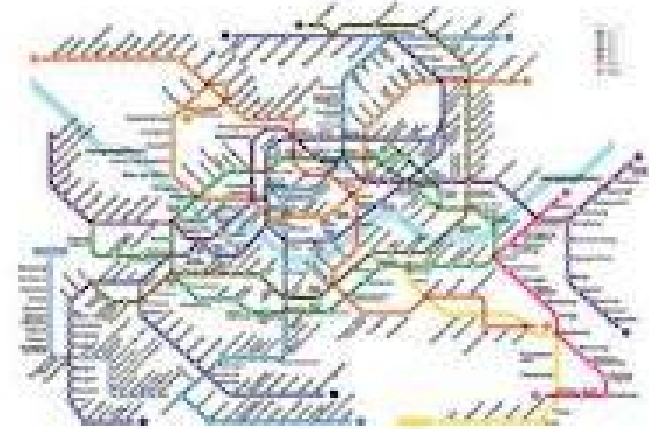

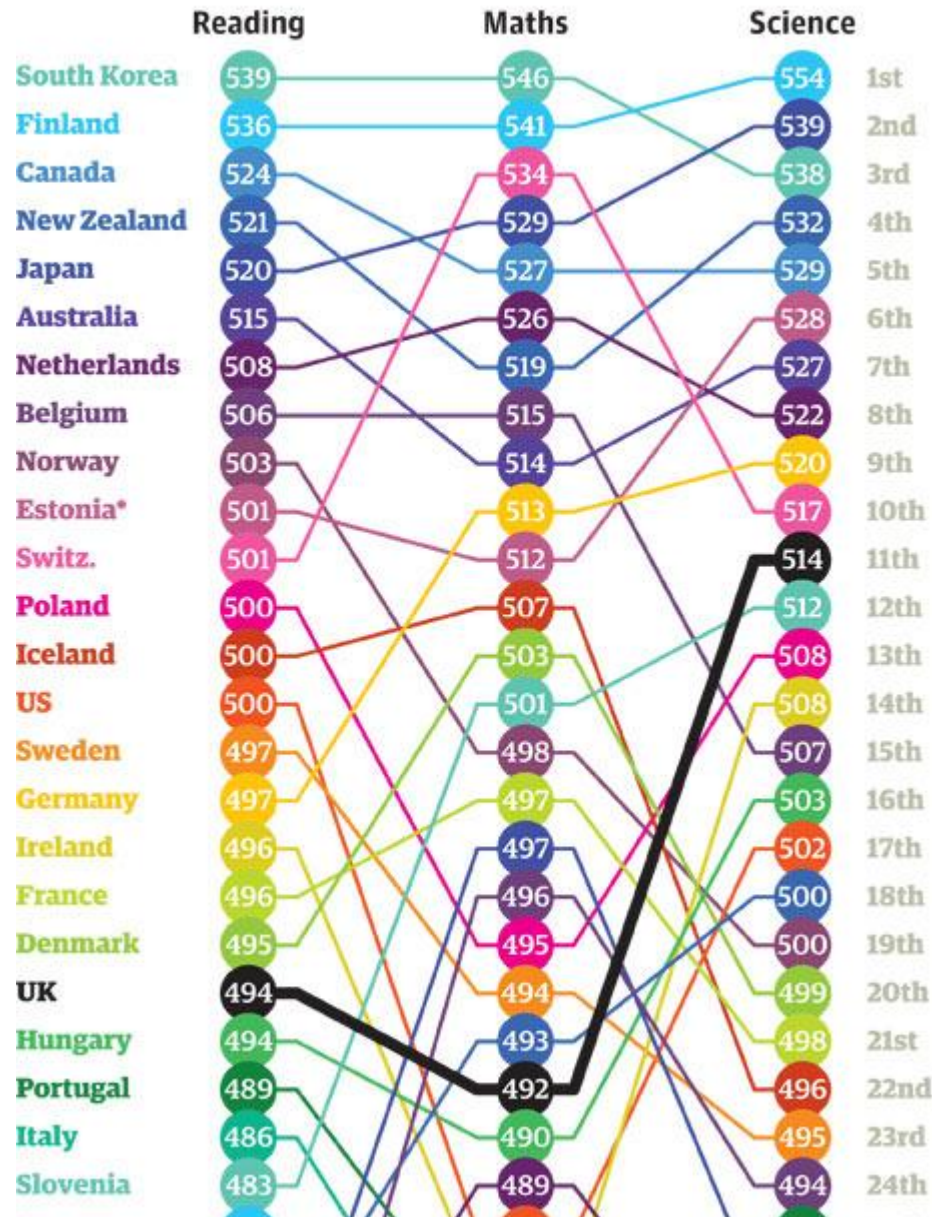
